Club moves to winter venue



With the calendar year well into autumn and winter on its way, the Willy Howe Model Flying Club has moved indoors.

Formed 12 years ago by three local model aircraft enthusiasts, the club currently has around 30 members and flies from a field between Wold Newton and Burton Fleming, in the shadow of Willy Howe, a large round barrow, known as a tumulus and a Scheduled Monument on the National Heritage List for England.

The current outdoor conditions do not lend themselves to flying, so members recommenced flying sessions at Bridlington CYP last Tuesday (18th

October).

Controlling a mix of aircraft, including fixed wing, helicopters, drones and rubber-powered gliders, the sessions take place in the confines of the main hall at the former Bridlington Sports Hall from 1:30pm to 3pm on a weekly basis.

Anyone is invited to go along, whether you wish to fly your model aircraft or would like to watch and meet socially.

There is an area serving hot and cold drinks, giving an opportunity to meet other members of the flying club.
